

CONSTITUTIONAL OVERSIGHT ASSEMBLY (C.O.A.) representatives elected from and by Local Council Members. Representatives serve until retirement or until voted out (de-elected) by their respective local constituency. New members elected only to replace de-elected/retired members when required. Meets to design/alter constitution and to appoint P.O.C. Commissioners.

CONSTITUTIONAL OVERSIGHT SECURITY OPERATIVES (C.O.S.O.) under authority of C.O.A. investigates and redresses constitutional breaches in the administration at all levels of government. Can delegate to Criminal Police, C.L.C. and N.E.R.A.F. Also handles security for C.O.A. members.

CRIMINAL POLICE investigates breaches of criminal law and enforces it under the authority of the C.L.C. and C.O.S.O.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING COMMISSION (E.T.C.) administers standards and policies for education and training at all levels.

PRIORITIES OVERSIGHT COMMISSION (P.O.C.) maintains Constitutional Values in Government Departments. It takes feedback and direction from all available sources. It replaces the present federal and state governments. Commissioners are appointed / dismissed by C.O.A. as required. The records of all sections of the community are accessible via the internet for continuous feedback to COA/POC. Good information far outranks confidentiality.

COMMUNITY LAW COUNCIL (C.L.C.) runs the court system which administers criminal law matters.

NATURAL RESOURCES AND SKILLS COMMISSION (N.R.S.C.) assesses availability of natural resources and skills for the purpose of production planning and capital creation / disbursement.

NATIONAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND ARMED FORCES (N.E.R.A.F.) - handles defense, emergency services, etc. Replaces C.F.A., Army, Navy, Air Force, and replaces / absorbs state emergency services, etc.

SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION (S.S.C.) assesses and implements living standard requirements for best possible quality of life, the arts, sports, medical support, leisure centers, etc.

FINANCIAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION (F.S.A.) manages financial services such as distribution of wages and social payments. It disburses capital grants to businesses and educational institutions, hospitals, electricity generators, N.E.R.A.F., etc. It replaces the banking sector but has no say in economic planning, etc. The F.S.A. is used to provide feedback on expenditure patterns, etc. to assist the N.R.S.C. and S.S.C. to plan and manage the economy. It is a purely administrative body and all its records are open to other departments and private individuals at all times. True democracy is only possible with free access to information.

VIRTUAL PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMY runs business enterprises with capital and running costs provided through the F.S.A. Here the day to day management decisions are made under the guidelines set by the N.R.S.C. This sector has no actual income from trading. All payments received at the retail level are recorded for planning and assessment purposes but funds then simply cease to exist. Consumer dollars go into a black hole here, never to be seen again. Money has no shelf life or real value, but information is very useful. As a result, the private sector economy, like the government, has no privacy. Its records are open to all for functional democracy. Information is always available to the N.R.S.C. and other branches of government for assessment and planning purposes. This sector handles research and development in conjunction with the N.R.S.C. and representatives from all industries are prominent in the N.R.S.C.

The People—All politics are played out on the local level. Important policy is developed and many administrative decisions are taken locally. The local government has much input on industry policy where local knowledge is often essential. Local politics are long term, and national figures are chosen here. Each Local Council elects one or more of its members to the C.O.A. as representative until retirement or de-election. Local council members are elected on the same basis by the local council electorate. If a de-elected Local Council member is also the C.O.A. rep., the member also ceases to be the C.O.A. representative. There are no periodic elections or fixed terms of office. All government records are fully accessible to the electorate at all times via the internet. Good planning and good ethics go hand in hand and don't need to be hidden. Competition is for sport and games. Democracy requires free access to information.
